INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

ST. PAUL'S CONVENT SCHOOL PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of St. Paul's Convent School Parent-Teacher Association ("the Association") set out on pages 3 to 8, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31st August, 2017, and the income and expenditure account and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the Association's affairs as at 31st August, 2017 and of its surplus and cash flows for the year then ended in compliance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards for Private Entities and Societies Ordinance.

Basis for opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Hong Kong Standards on Auditing ("HKSA's") issued by the HKICPA. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the HKICPA's Code of Ethics for Professional Accountant ("the Code"), and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Information other than the financial statements and auditor's report thereon

The directors are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises all information included in the directors' report and financial statements, but does not include the financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears to be materially misstated. If, based on the work we have performed, we conclude that there is a material misstatement of this other information, we are required to report that fact. We have nothing to report in this regard.

Executive Committee's responsibility for the financial statements

The Executive Committee are responsible for the preparation of financial statements that give a true and fair view in accordance with HKFRS for Private Entities issued by the HKICPA and the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance, and for such internal control as the directors determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, the executives are responsible for assessing the Association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the directors either intend to liquidate the Association or to cease operations, or have no realistic alternative but to do so.



1. GENERAL INFORMATION

The St. Paul's Convent School Parent – Teacher Association (“Association”) is being operated and complied with conditions as stated in the Parent-Teacher Association’s Constitution dated 4th October, 2007 (“the Constitution”) between Members and the Association. These financial statements did not include the transactions of tour income and expenditure incurred prior to 31st August, 2013.

2. PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards for Private Entities (HKFRS for Private Entities) issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. They have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Revenue recognition

Revenue from Government Grants and Refunds are recognized when the appropriated instruction are received from Government authority.

Membership fee is recognized on a straight line method over the period of subscription.

Program income is recognized when the services are rendered to the clients.

Interest income is recognized as it accrues using the effective interest method.

Expenses

Expenses are recognized on an accrual basis, they are recognized when a present obligation has arisen as a result of a past event and it is probable that a future outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, provided that a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

Foreign currency translation

(a) Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the financial statements of the Association are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the entity operates (the functional currency). These financial statements are presented in Hong Kong Dollars, which is the Association’s functional and presentation currency.

(b) Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation at year-end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are recognized in profit or loss.

Foreign exchange gains and losses that relate to borrowings and cash and cash equivalents are presented in profit or loss within “finance costs”. All other foreign exchange gains and losses are presented in profit or loss within “other income” or “other expenses”.
