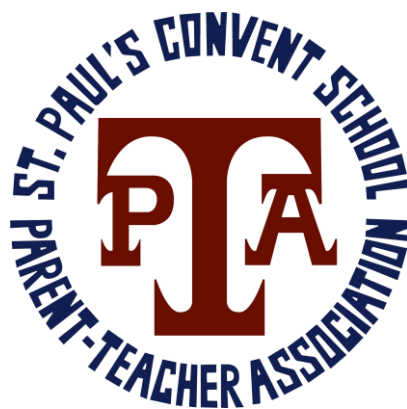

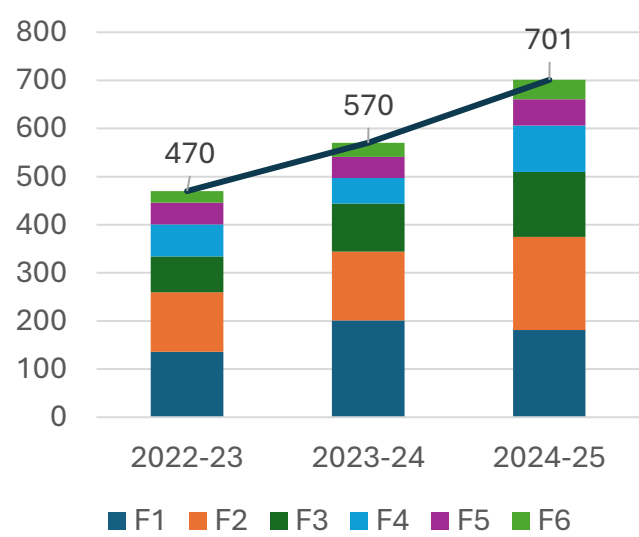

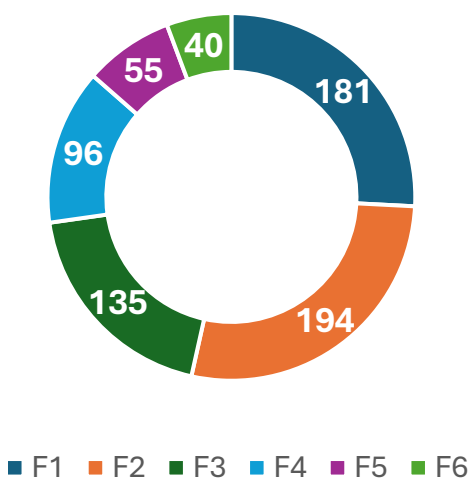

AI Workshop

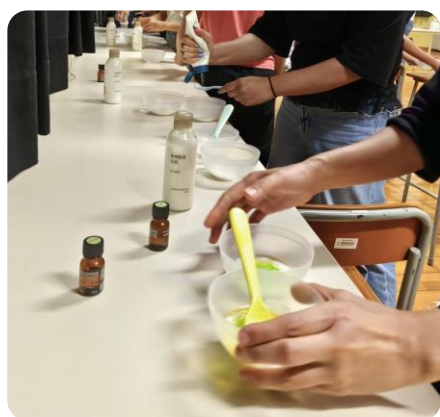

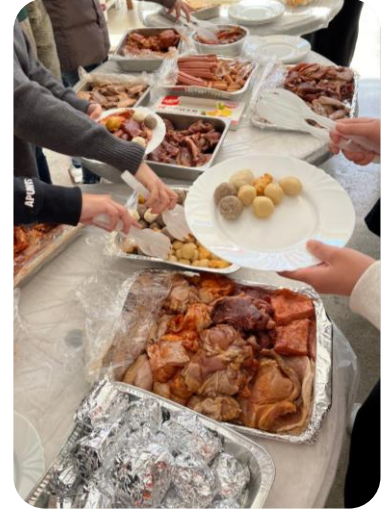
